

## These instructions will help you to complete the Postgraduate Application Form

IMPORTANT – Please complete a separate application form for each course you wish to apply for.

Please ensure that you complete the application form fully before submitting it, including making sure that you have applied for the correct course and have filled in the proposed study details.

## PERSONAL DETAILS

- **1. Name**: You must write your name as it appears on your passport and underline your surname/family name. The name you apply with will show on your graduation parchment when you gain your award.
- 2. Ethnic Origin (UK applicants only): Please enter the code from the list below which best describes your ethnic origin.

- **3.** Disability/Special Needs: In order to assist the University to assess any special facilities you may need, please enter the code from the list below which is most appropriate to you.

- 4. Fee Status: If you are a UK national, please state your Place of Birth and Nationality. If you are from out-with the UK, please complete all sections. If you have a passport already, please send a copy of the page with your photograph, name, date of birth, nationality and date and place of issue on it.
- 5. External Study: Research applicants only. Applies to applicants who wish to study mainly outwith the university (eg an applicant using facilities at their place of employment or an applicant based in an overseas university/college).

# 6. Criminal Convictions:

Instructional courses normally begin in late September, and the majority of research degrees also take place at the beginning of the academic year, although it is possible to register at other times of the year. There is no formal closing date for applications, but International applicants should be advised that an early application (preferably by 31 March) should be made to allow enough time to complete the visa process.

Applications for financial support/scholarships are handled separately. You are advised that an offer of an academic place does NOT imply the award of a scholarship.

Please note that many departments will wish to consider a number of applications for a course before making a decision, and a speedy response to an applicant is not always possible.
